PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Rec. Board is continuing its efforts to make sure the Park is taken care of. In that spirit, the Rec. Board has decided to make sure that the Park continues the beloved tradition of the Fishing Derby. The Rec. Board would like to thank Mike Ford for his long-standing and continued commitment to the Park and the Fishing Derby. His tireless efforts are much appreciated and any volunteers who would like to help out are encouraged to do so. Please call me to let me know you'd like to help.

Unfortunately, not all of the Park's happenings will generate as much joy as the Fishing Derby. Despite numerous potential negative impacts to everyone who owns a home in the Park, the HOA has filed a complaint regarding the Park's operations with the California Public Utilities Commission (PUC). Attached to this newsletter is a copy of the HOA's complaint to the PUC. The Rec. Board firmly believes that the issues in the complaint are simply false and we do not understand what the desired outcome of the complaint is. We are unsure whether or not the complaint accurately reflects the voices of the homeowners.

The Rec. Board would like every homeowner to have a voice with regards to the operation or our Park. Therefore, the Rec. Board has determined that on **April 7, 2012**, after the recall, the first of two town-hall style meetings will be assembled to discuss our options and the future of the Park. We do understand that the majority of the Park's lot owners do not live in the Park and that Easter weekend can be difficult for a meeting, so we have also scheduled a second meeting for **April 14, 2012** to discuss the same items. We have been working hard to explore all the Park's options including: forming a legal HOA, creating a mutual water company and becoming a PUC-regulated water company. All of these options are most likely going to cost significantly more than the current system. We highly encourage everyone that has an interest in the Park to get involved with the discussion and be part of the solution.

On a happier note, I would like to thank the many homeowners who shared with me their compliments regarding our caretaker and his great job on keeping the roads clear during the recent snow storms. ~Shaun Velayas

INTERIM MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 8:32 AM by President Velayas. Board members present: Adams, Barrett, Clark, Hawke, Velayas and Ordwein. Board member Wallis attended by telephone. Board member Peter was excused.

INVOCATION: Given by Director Hawke

HOMEOWNERS AND OTHERS PRESENT: Caretaker, Mark Higgins and homeowner Mike Van Gundy.

CORRESPONDENCE: Clark reported the receipt of a letter from the Kellys in response to our letter requesting further information on their request for a lot realignment. President Velayas will contact them by phone for further information.

A complaint was filed with the C.P.U.C. by attorney Ann Rankin who represents the OFS Homeowners Association. A hearing with the C.P.U.C. is scheduled for April 12, 2012.

MINUTES OF BOARD MEETINGS of February 18, 2012: Hawke moved that the minutes be accepted as presented, Barrett seconded, motion carried.

DIRECTOR REPORTS

WATER-HAWKE: Director Hawke reported there were no water line breaks since the February 18th meeting. However, one property owner had a broken line and the water was shut off by our caretaker who tried to call the property owner to no avail because their listed phone has been disconnected. Owners are encouraged to keep their phone numbers and addresses up to date by sending changes to the OFSRA BOD at PO Box 116, Long Barn, CA 95335. Water pumped for the month of February was 598,600 gallons.

BUILDINGS-BARRETT: Director Barrett reported the microwave has been installed in the caretaker's cabin. Coming up for the next fiscal year there will be some expenses to repair the dry rot in both the caretaker's cabin and the lodge. The costs are yet to be determined.

ROADS-ADAMS: Director Adams reported that caretaker Mark received three bids for a four year plan for crack sealing and slurry sealing. Mark presented a prioritized chart of work to be done. The three bids were from Simunaci Construction, George Reed and Ken's Asphalt. It was determined that the first year will be the most expensive due to the inbound side of the entry gate needing to be resurfaced along with the entry to the con yard. Director Adams will further review the bids received before the next regular BOD meeting and then make his recommendations. If property owners need to have their driveways resurfaced, they can schedule the work to be done with the contractor themselves to coincide with the time when the contractor is in the park doing the park road work. Ample prior notice will be given to all homeowner's as to when the road work will be done so they can schedule their own work.

EQUIPMENT-PETER: President Velayas reported for Director Peter the solenoids for the switch for the grader have been ordered.

TIMBER – **WALLIS:** President Velayas reported he and Del have received a forest management report from forester Will Dorel regarding the timber on the old Cedar Brook property. They have not had a chance to review the report yet, but will have a report for the membership at the annual meeting.

GATE-ORDWEIN: Director Ordwein is now fully in charge of all gate functions. He is still waiting for some additional records. Discussion was held regarding policies, procedures and record keeping methods. It was also suggested that a gate report be part of the regular Director Reports at each Board meeting. For the Newsletter it was suggested that homeowners contact Mark or Bill with any gate

issues.

HEALTH AND SAFETY-ADAMS: No report.

FINANCE-WALLIS: Director Wallis noted that the budget is at about 75% of the annual amount and that is where it should be at this time of year. Funds are still being transferred from the various reserve accounts to cover the costs of managing the Park expenses. These funds should be reimbursed when the dispute with the OFSHA is settled. Bills in the amount of \$18,835.78 were approved for payment. Del suggested the chart of accounts be reviewed and brought in line with generally accepted charts of accounts. He will get together with Carlson to do this. Board members will present to Del an anticipated budget for the next fiscal year.

Odd Fellows Sierra Homeowners' Association ("OFSHA") is a non-profit mutual benefit corporation whose directors are democratically elected by owners of all 281 lots within the Odd Fellows Sierra Park. The water for all the lot owners is supplied by Odd Fellows Sierra Recreation Association ("OFSRA"). The water system is required to be regulated by the CPUC under California Public Utility Code 2701 and 2702, but is not. OFSRA consists only of Odd Fellows and Rebekahs; OFSRA provides no financial transparency concerning costs it incurs in providing water to lot owners.
