Rhien, salary for Oct. \$75.00--It was regularly moved and seconded that the bills be paid, with only the first installment for taxes. Carried.

After some discussion about the way the tax bills were made out it was moved and seconded that the secretary meet with the tax col2 lector and try and straighten the matter out. Carried. Bob Hodgson brought up the matter of straightening out the maps and it was moved and seconded that Loren Hosmer and the secretary take care of the matter. Carried. After some discussion about what to do with the money received from the Hi-way property, it was moved and seconded that we pay Oakland Lodge \$2000.00 of the amount recieved. Carried. The building rules were read by Loren Hosmer and it was moved and seconded that they be accepted.anCarried. It was moved and seconded that 500 copies each of the building rules, By-laws, Park rules, water system rules and regulations etc. be mimeographed.aon this question Loren Hosmer brought up the matter of having all the rules and regulations printed and put in book form, so as to have them all together for more convenience. The matter was laid on the table until next meeting so estimates could be gotten on the expense. Loren Hosmer was to get such estimates and report at the next meeting.

The next meeting to be held at Escobar's residence in Manteca Tuesday Nov. 29th. No further business appearing the meeting was closed, after which Mrs. Hodgson brought in coffee and cake, which was delicious.
