Inspectors from the state were in the Park on October 19 to inspect the water system Due to the diligent efforts of Mark Higgins, Directors Peter and Hawke and Water Operations licensee Don Nessl, the inspection went very well. Good job!!!

The Park has an opportunity and will work with Cover and Sons to reclaim part of the meadow, which was washed out with the great run-off in January 1997. The area behind Well House #6 beyond the "DANGER" sign near the lake will be filled in with stumps hauled in by Cover. They will be placed to rebuild the original bank of the creek and then backfilled. The dirt, which was removed from the lake, will then be used as fill to cover the stumps. This same method was used to reclaim a portion of he meadow about 15 years ago. The Department of Fish and Game supports this type of meadow reclamation. There will be no cost to the Park. The Park helps Cover dispose of the stumps and the Park benefits by reclaiming the meadow.

Mark Higgins has been busy. Among other tasks, he has insulated water boxes, graded the road to the water tanks off David and Isaac, worked on tank and well houses preparing for the inspection, checked water levels daily, worked on valves at water tanks, weed eaten around water tanks, winterized water pipes in the Park, repaired a water leak on Deborah, packed trash, cleaned up at dumpster, repaired flat on generator and set up the Lodge for the Oktoberfest.

The Board continues to work to meet the needs of the Park. We are open to suggestions. So, please, send us your comments via e-mail or regular mail.

If you have issues for the Board to consider, please submit them in writing to the Board at least two weeks before the Board meeting so that research can be completed and the item placed on the agenda for the next meeting. There were comments attributed to Larry Vaugh in the minutes of the 9/25 meeting that were not made by him. WATER REPORT

Director Hawke reported that there was one water leak this month that was promptly repaired. Significant progress has been made on several maintenance tasks our water system has needed. Paul Krawchuk has assembled an Operations Manual and has been on site and assisted with the preparations for the inspection by the State Department of Public Health on October 21st.

Follow up of items found by the diver inspection by Inland is in progress. Specifically, investigation of how to stop corrosion of the Isaac tank support and the Wheeler bolts is being investigated. Cathodic systems are quite expensive. Coating of the bolts and repair of the Isaac support structure in under investigation. Water usage for the month of September was 1,124,300 gallons.

OAK TREE AT CORP YARD

The oak tree at the Corp Yard is available for cutting by Park residents for use within the Park beginning on Saturday, November 6th. This is a very large tree and care should be exercised while cutting.

ODD FELLOWS SIERRA RECREATION ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING October 16, 2010

INTERIM MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 8:40 AM by President Harvey. Board members present: Clark, Emery, Harvey, Hawke, Peter, Varvayanis, and Velayas. Board members excused: Barrett, Fialho.

INVOCATION: Given by Ron Hawke

HOMEOWNERS AND OTHERS PRESENT: Homeowner, Steve Wallace; Caretaker, Mark Higgins

COMMENTS: Steve Wallace stated that Jerry Cover had contacted him regarding bringing in some stumps to use as backfill at the lake to help preserve the meadow as they had done sometime in the past. President Harvey will investigate. Mr. Wallace also read a letter from Fred Coleman who listed some of his questions as to how the Board is conducting business: 1) Were written bids from a number of mechanics received before selecting Sierra Village Chevron to work on the snow plow; 2) Are itemized bills being approved by the Board showing the costs of labor and materials and 3) Does the Park have a copy of liability insurance on file from Sierra Village Chevron in case there are problems with the work. Mr. Wallace then stated that all vendors should be required to show proof of liability insurance.

CORRESPONDENCE: Harvey reported receiving correspondence from: Carrie McKernan re: relocation; Mary Wallace re: benches looking great and the dog park being dusty and needing water; Cathy Canales re: are bids required for projects over a specific amount, speed bump replacement and other concerns; Vicki Stewart (Pasa) re: reducing assessments for lot owners. Response was received from Sierra Nevada Communications to our letter of inquiry as to their progress. Also Comcast responded to our letter of inquiry regarding them providing service to the Park.

MINUTES OF BOARD MEETINGS of September 25: Varvayanis noted that the results of the closed session of the September 11 Special Board meeting were not in those minutes. He moved that the results be stated in the minutes of the September 25 meeting and that the minutes of the September 25 meeting be approved as corrected. Those results were that the Board determined to make funds available in the form of cashier's checks to have on hand for the auction sale of the Camp Cedarbrook property on September 21st. Hawke seconded, motion carried.

On October 2, the Board approved the following resolution by email:

Resolve: The Odd Fellows Sierra Homeowners Association, Board of Directors directs the treasurer to open a checking account at Oak Valley Bank, 14580 Mono Way, Sonora, California 95370. Two signatures will be required for each check. The Board of Directors authorizes the treasurer and the president to sign all checks. Dated October 2, 2010 - signed Linda Clark, Secretary Hawke moved the resolution be formally approved at this meeting, Varvayanis seconded. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

WATER-HAWKE: One water leak this month. Significant progress has been made on several maintenance tasks. An Operations Manual has been assembled by Paul Krawchuk. Don Nessl has been on site assisting with preparations for an inspection by the State Department of Public Health, scheduled for October 21. Follow up of items found by the diver inspection by Inland is in progress. Investigation of how to stop corrosion of the Isaac tank support and the Wheeler tank bolts is being investigated. Water usage for September was 1,124,300 gallons Director Hawke requests again that everyone please update their contact information, especially their current phone numbers

ROADS-EMERY: Snow stakes are nearly all in place. He has spoken with Director Peter about having Mark drive through the park to shore up any soft shoulders by placing base rock and feathering out to avoid breaking off the shoulders. George Reed has completed the crack sealing project adequately. Suggests other vendors be contacted for future road work.

BUILDINGS-BARRETT: No Report

EQUIPMENT-PETER: Snow plow work is nearly finished and should be ready by next week. Peter will contact Clay Peterson for being a back up this year for snow plowing as needed. Hawke noted that Mark has done a great job using the grader to improve some of the dirt roadways. Discussion continued regarding the brakes and chains for the grader and Mark's further familiarization with the equipment.

TIMBER-VARVAYANIS: Ace Tree Company has provided his proof of liability insurance. The tree on Esther has not yet been removed.

HEALTH AND SAFETY-FIALHO: President Harvey stated she has contacted Caldwell Insurance Company as to wording for the Dog Park signage as to liability issues. She is waiting for a response. She also reported that the replacement Evacuation Signs will be ordered at the same time the Dog Park signs are ordered as the cost will be less per sign when they are ordered together.

RECREATION-CLARK: The Oktoberfest is anticipated to be a huge success. People have been very responsive in calling in their reservations. Attendance is anticipated to be about 100.

EVACUATION/DEFENSIBLE SPACE GRANT-HARVEY: The RAC grant needs final approval by Tuolumne County Board of Supervisors and will be administered through the Fire Safe Council. She will be working with them to get the contracts let for the removal of brush and ladder fuels along the evacuation routes. There are three property owners that need to be contacted to get their approval for the removal of the brush and fuels.

GATE-VARVAYANIS: Computer for gate is still being researched. Suggested that regular maintenance of gate be scheduled. All individuals should know their three digit code.

FINANCE-VELAYAS: Total bills \$8,296.82. Moved by Hawke seconded by Emery to pay the bills. Motion carried. Requested approval to transfer \$250,000 to Wells Fargo Bank interest bearing, fully insured Money Market account and open another interest bearing, fully insured Money Market account at another bank so that interest can be earned. Currently, we have \$526,000 at Oak Valley Bank in a non-interest bearing, fully insured account. Clark moved that Velayas be given the authority to open accounts to best utilize interest bearing accounts available. Hawke seconded. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- **1. Audit vs. Financial Review-**After discussion it was determined that further investigation and possible other firms contacted is needed before making a decision. Tabled for discussion at next regular Board meeting.
- 2. Bids for old mower-Due to lateness of the Newsletter going out, the deadline for receiving bids has been moved to October 31st.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Disposition of the oak tree that fell near the Corp Yard. Too big to move. After discussion, Hawke moved that the oak tree by the Corp Yard should be made available for cutting by Park residents for use within the Park beginning Saturday, October 30. Peter seconded. Motion carried. *****NOTE: Due to lateness of Newsletter going out this date has been moved to Saturday, November 6, 2010 to allow for fairness to all*****
- 2. Cover and Stumps President Harvey will contact Ed Smith for information as to previous stump backfill project and report back to Board..
- 3. Correspondence from delinquent property owners. After discussion, Hawke moved that the Board reserves the right not to respond to correspondence from homeowners who are delinquent with their assessments. Velayas seconded. Motion carried.
- 4. Discussion was held regarding possible storage of RV's on Park property. Determined this is not a good idea at this time.

PRESSIDENT HARVEY ANNOUNCED that in the Executive Session, it was determined that we will seek input from Roger Brown in regard to property infringements and other legal issues. It was also agreed that the OFSRA will pay the direct fees and supplies associated with Mark Higgins attending classes to pursue his Water License and that he can use the Park pickup for travel to and from classes and exams.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:19 AM
