DEBRIS BOX Due To County And State Regulations

- 1. Container must be set on a hard, level surface.
- No excessive rocks, dirt, gravel or cement in container without <u>first</u> consulting our office or driver.
- 3. No brush, slash, yard waste, tree stumps, vehicles, tires, or hazardous waste is to be placed in container.
- 4. Heavy materials are to be loaded first in the containers.
- 5. Do not fill container over the top.
- Load evenly. Nothing is to be hanging over the sides or sticking out of the top.
- 7. Make sure the doors are closed and container is loaded properly before calling in for a pick up.
- 8. When calling in for service, make sure the container is easily accessible.

BRUSH_BINS

- 1. Clean brush, slash, and burnable yard waste only.
- 2. No garbage, dirt, rocks, cement, metal, plastic or tree stumps are to be put in the container.
- 3. Do not fill container over the top.
- 4. Loads will be returned to the customer at customers expense if the load is rejected at the disposal site.

We reserve the right to refuse to pick up any load that is unsafe, or overweight. All unsafe conditions must be corrected at your expense before loads are picked up.before loads are picked up.
