CORPORATE RESTRUCTURING - Wallis - Copies of restructuring papers are to be included in the mailing of the April minutes.

TIMPER MANAGEMENT - Trees are being marked in two compartments and bids are being requested. No commitment will be made to harvest until the bids are received.

EQUIPMENT:- Martin - Concern was registered by Van Norman that snew plowing was being performed only on the read and none for cabin parking. No action was taken.

BUILDINGS - Mitchell - The remodeling of the caretaker's cabin is close to being complete. Motion by Wallis, sec. by Linthicum to purchase two ceiling fans for the recreation hall- cost not to exceed \$400.00. Passed. ROADS - Akers - Work for 1983 and 1984 will focus on adding culverts. FINANCE - Van Norman - Motion by Van Norman sec, by Bell to pay bills amounting to \$2,655.45. Passed.

Metion by Bell, sec. by Wallis to include netice of Annual Meeting in the same mailing as the restructuring papers. Passed.
