DELINGUENT ASSESSMENT POLICY

Association annual assessments become due and payable on the first day of June every year for both homeowners and lot owners. Any annual assessment not paid by the 31st day of August shall be deemed delinquent and a \$10.00 late charge assessed to the delinquent account.

Any assessment not paid by the due date of August 31st shall accrue interest from the date of delinquency at a rate established and proclaimed by the Board of Directors from time to time. At this time, a notice will be sent to the delinquent owner via certified mail advising of this condition and requesting the amount needed to bring the account current or water will be shut off. if this request is not met and the assessments become two months past due, the delinquent owners will be contacted by the County Recorder stating that a "Notice of Assessment Lien" has been recorded and that charges for fees and costs incurred will be added to the amount owed.

If payment of the delinquent assessments plus all fees, interest and costs is not received within thirty (30) days following the filing of the "Notice of Assessment Lien" a "Notice of Default" will be recorded by the Association and the owner so advised.

If payment of all past due assessments, fees, interest and costs is still not paid within ninety (90) days from the filing of the "Notice of Default" the property will be posted with a "Notice of Trustee Sale" and a legal notice announcing the sale will be published in a newspaper of general circulation. If full payment is not made, twenty days after the publication the property will be sold at foreclosure sale.

Owners and former owners remain personally liable for delinquent assessment and deficiency balances which accrued during their ownership and the board will proceed against those individuals in any way available under the law.

It is the intent of the Association to send late notices as outlined in this procedure as a courtesy to the homeowners or lot owners, but the Association accepts no responsibility for notices not received by the homeowners or lot owners except that notices will be sent as required by law under foreclosure proceedings. Rather, the Board of Directors of the Association expects each homeowner or lot owner to be aware of these procedures and understand their responsibility to pay all assessments on time.

In amount of \$250.00 per lot, with the option of paying it in annual payments not to exceed tive years. A motion was made by Bill Kilgore, seconded by Elsie Manning to suspend the reading of the minutes from the last annual meeting and approve as corrected. Motion carried. CORRESPONDENCE: NONE

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

EDUIPMENT - Wayne Harvey - Last years report was a little on to grown side out this year our equipment is in dood condition. Last years, cool was appropriated for equipment repair and \$9,043.00 was used. This year, of the \$10,000 appropriated, we spent \$2.043.00. (The exc of \$6.655.00 was used on road repair.) Much of the credit goes to our caretaker bale Smith for his time and efforts in detting the equipment shape. The new truck has saved time and dollars, also fuel costs as the truck is more economical to run. The truck will be used this sum in repairing roads.

TIMBER - Larry Adams - We have not done a green cut for severa vears due to the drought conditions, but have had salvage cuts each ve clearing up the bug killed trees. This year we are in pretty good shalwe have some partially dead trees that have been marked for removal by our forester.

RECREATION - Gordon Greene - Recreation is a very important par of this park. The last year we have had several successful potlucks/streed. St Fatrick's Day Dinner, which we will do again this year. The Fishing Derby will be held on father's bay weekend. The Derby is open kids 15 years and under.

HEALTH & SAFETY - Bordon Greene reporting for Jim Clifton - We have have trouble with firearms in the park this past Year, including a rash of incidents with BB guns. A dog has been killed and window shot out. individuals need to take action it they are aware of any of these incidents by letting the Board of Directors, Sheriff and/or caretaker know. Sneeding cars in the bark are a real concern for the safety of c children and adults. Please slow down and adhere to the 20 mile per hoposted speed. Children have been butting rocks in the valve boxes of fire hydrants which will impede fire safety, should the need arise. The park has accorded the BLM (Bureau of Land Management) rules for two, the and four wheel vehicles concerning the use of safety helmets. The burn pile is open for forest debris only (Needles, branches, bark, and pine comes). For safety we recommend that you use the burn area instea of purning on your own property. A rattlesnake was found by the caretaker near the lake so be aware of the activities of your children and caution is advised. The board has proceeded slowly on the establishment of fines being levied for infractions of the park rules ϵ regulations. The closure of the Sugar Fine cond barn road on the east and west perimeters has helped keep down the amount of trash being brought into the park. This should also requee vandalism and burglaric in the area. Cal Sierra Disposal is accepting only wet/household garbade. Loads containing other darbade will be returned to us to be sorted at an additional expense to the park. Dorothy Goff stated that stray cars are an increasing problem here in the park. It was suggested that animal control be contacted with the possibility of trapping cats and removing them from the area. Bill Kildore made a comment about people's need to read the minutes and being aware of rules in the park. Randy Tolbert commented on the need for part time renters to be informa of park rules and regulations. Ultimately, should any problems arise, the property owners will be held responsible. Theresa Dietrich stated that people should postathe rules and regulations in their cabin, to be observed by their occupants. Question, by Bardara Endvall as to clarification on the use of picnic grounds area.

ROADS - Wavne harvev praises Sien Mitchell for all the work he has done to develop a map, which reflects a five year plan to uporade the roads in the bark. The map is being utilized to plan year approaches to repairing and maintaining the roads. With the help of young men. Dale will work on the roads before they deteriorate enough trequire major expensitures. Sealer is important as a maintenance tool. The bar ditches on the sides of the road should be kept cleaned out. This will brain off the water and minimize damage to the roadbed.

FINANCE - Bill Zobel - This past year we stayed within the budget and we nobe to do the same this year. We are not recommending increase in the budget, although allocations have been shifted. Mark Bradley raised a question on the amount budgeted for water. Phill Gil and Bob Hintz questioned the expenses of pumping water. A change in billing will be implemented this year in order to save postage and bookkeepint expenses. ONLY ONE BILL WILL BE SENT OUT AND IS DUE AND PAYABLE WHEN RECEIVED. If not paid bromptly, the next bill you receive will include penalties.

WATER REPORT - Gordon Greene reporting for Jim Pernetti - A critical situation could arise should a failure occur in our water system. Fast problems have included shallow wells which are being upgraded. We have also experienced deterioration of the "main tank" which upon inspection has tree roots coming through the walls and the concrete is flaking and cracking. The "main tank" is located on the no side of the park and regulates the water flow of the system. Consumpt is expected to increase and recommended solutions to our problems inclreplacing the concrete cank with a reconditioned steel tank which will hold 70.000 gallons, at a cost of \$25,000. An additional \$20,000 will required to deepen the Meadow Well, install a new pump and California mandated Well House. Tom Greene questioned what the time frame would to set aside the funds for these improvements in the water system. It was advised that action will need to be taken within a five year perio If we upgrade the tank and well, we will need a total assessment of \$125.00 per lot. Mark Bradlev made the statement that the tank on the west side was maintained for fire fighting reserve only.

OLD BUSINESS - NOME

NEW BUSINESS - Mark Bradley requested that a review be done took into a way that we could more eduitably levy annual assessments take into consideration part-time, full-time, renter, vacant lot, etc. Mark Bradley will be chairperson of ad not committee to investidate means of assessing and supporting the park.
