All members present except Adams, excused. MINUTES -The minutes of the 6/11/95 meeting were approved as printed. CARETAKERS REPORT - Thank Ben Hunter for cleaning litter around the lake every morning. Thank Dick Cakebread for keeping the park clean. CORRESPONDENCE -1. From Sonora Insurance Asency - policy. 2. Water Resources Board - meeting, 3. Boy Scouts of America - Information on summer program. 4. Harold Little - Request for information on voting privileges. 5. Warren Ihrig and Theresa Dietrich - complaining on the assessment. 6. Tim Tate -permit for timber harvest. 7. Tax bills - which show the increase for this year. MEMBERS BEFORE THE BOARD - 1. Bonnie Stevens and Chuck James - representatives from the Forestry Department. They presented the Forestry view point on fire danger and protection measures. Metal on Forestry view point on fire danger and protection measures. Metal on rocks have a continuing problem in causing fires. Undergrowth adds to the fire danger and is particularly bad this year. As an example of cost a recent one fourth acre fire cost the Forestry \$3,000.00. Off highway vehicles are required to have spark arresters and a green sticker from the DMV. Unlicensed children must be supervised by an adult. See letter on a meeting to discuss these problems. COMMITTEE REPORTS WATER -Greene -Water use: 508,000 gals. Tan are nooked into the system and are being filled. MSC to replace the float system with a sensor system to control the pumping. There was discussion on controlling growth in the lake. There was no decision. There will be further study on all the implications, ROADS - Morrison-Bridge will start tomorrow (July 10). Will be closed to vehicular traffic until the job is complete.

Traffic will have to go around by the Boy Scout grounds to get out.

No delivery trucks to the isolated section of the park will be allowed during the construction. There are several lots that need culvert work. The secretary will write to owners involved.

BUILDINGS -Hawke -The Rec Hall needs a larger sink for washing large pots. There is also a need for more storage. Ron Hawke is to get prices on these items. The window in the ladies room must be fixed.

TIMBER -Adams - No report The bridge TIMBER -Adams - No report RECREATION -Bonner - There were 68 kids at the fish derby. They all had a fine time. There was \$144 donated at the derby and other donations since totalling almost, \$500. The cost of fish and other items for the derby came to approximately \$950. This will be taken care of we are There is to be NO cutting of standing trees in the undeveloped land. If a tree is not on the ground it is to be left standing. EQUIPMENT - Smith - The pick up needs a new battery. FINANCE -Zobel - Any assessments not paid on by July 31 will be turned over to the collection agency. We have heard from 267 of the 323 members as of this date. More come in daily. The Timber Fund has been fully reimpursed for the snow plow. Bills for July total \$10,421.45. MSC that we pay the bills. MSC to continue to collect our assessments as we have in the past. A meeting has been scheduled on September 2,1995 at 10:00 AM at the recreation hall for owners/operators of ATVs. The meeting will be conducted by representatives of the U.S. Forestry Service concerning the potential fire danger of ATV operations in the forest. This meeting id highly recommended since all of us, ATV owners and nonowners, have a great deal to lose in event of a fire. This meeting might help prevent a tragedy that could wipe out our investment.

There will also be a voluntary inspection of your ATVs at the meeting in order to determine if they meet regulations.

The following is the major portion of a letter that was sent in response to a complaint of the voting system that exists in this

Please be aware of some of the history of the Pank: In 1948 a group of members of the Independent Order of Odd fellows purchased the property - about 600 acres from a Mr. Sylvester. They wrote by-laws that made it mandatory that anyone buying into the park must belong to the Order - Odd Fellows or Rebekans. The by-laws had a 25 year self-destruct clause in it - that is, a new set of by-laws had to be written in 1973. It took ten years to develop a set of by-laws that would be legal. To accomplish the intent of th original group it was necessary to establish two organizations: A Homeowners Association composed of all owners in the park whether belonging to the Order or not; and a Recreation Association composed of those Homeowners who belonged to the Order. The Homeowners own their individual lots and any structures that the lot may contain. The Recreation Association owns all the undeveloped land, including the Rec. Hall and the caretaker's cabin and the fire house.

As to voting rights: There is no restriction on voice at the Annual Meetings; there may be some restriction on letters to the Board from one who is a homeowner but not a member of the Recreation Association but it is highly unlikely that it will be exercised. As to voting: Homeowners vote on the money matters; Recreation members vote on the Board members, since nearly all the business of the park is concerned with running the undeveloped land and park buildings, that is, Roads, Park buildings and equipment, water system. It is not really "taxation without representation" since you do have a voice and vote on the assessments. If your wife belongs to the Rebekans you have full voting rights.

The by-laws provide ; that one person gets one vote, no more than one vote per lot. That has been interpreted so that if each of the husband and wife belongs to the Order and they own two lots they can be allowed two votes (one each).

The system of Proxies was included since that is a legal requirement. It has helped us to achieve a quorum much more quickly than we did before the proxy system was contained in the by-laws.
