Dear John:

This is in reference to the two water samples which you brought in to be tested for Mr. Bell. We have completed basic tests and our findings are identical on both samples.

Iron: minimal

Hardness: 8 grains per gallon

pH: 7.4 (alkaline)

Sediment: Fines suspended

This water is of average quality and while it is a little on the hard side, no specific treatment would be indicated if it is for regular household use.

The only other factor which might require checking is for nitrates and this would have to be done by a commercial laboratory and if you would like this accomplished, please advise; the cost is \$16.50.

I believe we had sent to you regular water sample collection bottles and I would suggest you utilize these in the future, to give a true sample of what we wish to test.

Also would you please indicate the conditions on our water sample data sheet that we may better analyze your requirements, a few are attached.

In respect to the present samples, obviously there is something that your customer requires to be corrected. If you will tell me what is involved I will be happy to arrange for an additional analysis.

Nitrates are a problem in your area in view of the intrusion from commercial fertilizing sources. The only way I know to minimize this on an economical basis for household use is through reverse osmosis filtration. We have these units in small household sizes and will go into these during our meetings here in San Francisco for the Hydro dealers on January 29 and 30.

John, I certainly am sorry that I missed our appointment, but I hope to see you here at the Hydro Meetings at the Hya tt House.
